A healthy mind

The brain is the most amazing part of our body and despite all medical research nobody really understands everything about it. But just like our bodies, it needs to be cared for in ways that can be quite simple. Another way of improving your mind is to make sure you regularly visit new places and have new experiences. Personally I find learning Spanish is a great way to keep the brain working, but communication in any language is important. Having a conversation is so much better for your brain than staring at a computer screen or at other people talking on TV.


